The costs are higher than the amount being requested in the PIF and the Project managers indicate that to reduce the cost even further will make it very difficult to implement this project given the size and complexity of the project. The sector being addressed by this project had one 1000 hospitals and as such the management of a project covering the whole sector requires additional time and staff resources.
